Literature: We are reading our final book *Fever 1793* about the Yellow Fever epidemic in Philadelphia.

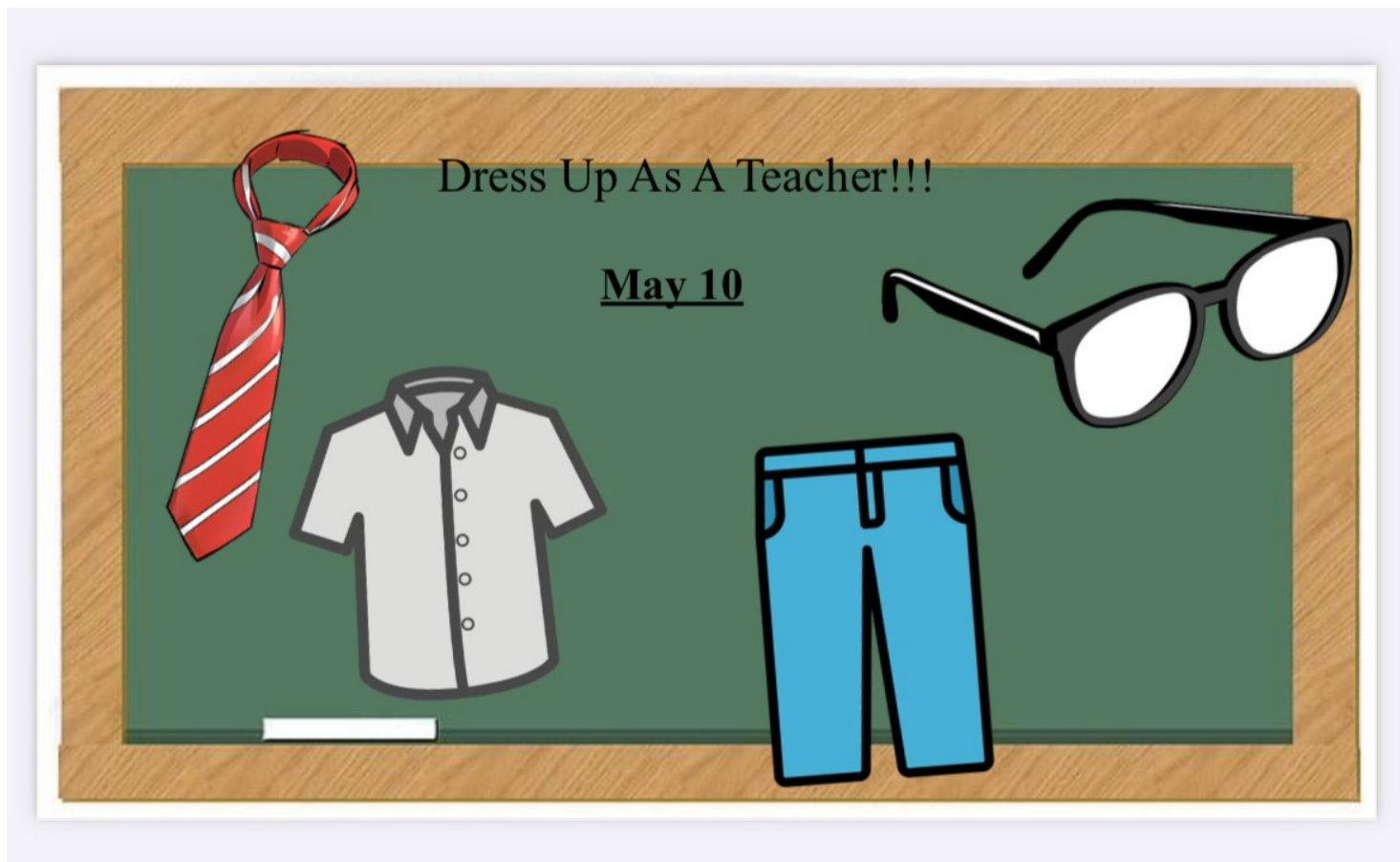
